

ALBERT NICHOLS, BOATSWAIN ON THE TITANIC



Albert Nichols 1864-1912, was a third generation Lord Howe Islander and was the first born of Thomas and Mary Nichols part of an early settler family on the island. He was not particularly fond of his parents, his mother being a very hard taskmaster, and actually testified against them in a letter to Captain Richard Armstrong, the resident Magistrate on the island in August 1879. Armstrong held other official positions of importance as well.

Albert is reputed to have kept a bonfire ready to light at Blinky Beach on the island with

the view of summoning a passing ship and getting away from it all.. At a little older than 18, he actually saw a ship passing, lit his beacon, and when a boat put into the island to investigate, he convinced the crew that he had been shipwrecked on the island.

He left the island without a word to family, married later in England, worked on ships for a time, eventually becoming the boatswain on the ill-fated Titanic.

In the boatshed at Pinetrees Guesthouse Lord Howe Island is a poster proclaiming the White Star Line Titanic of 45,000 tons, "the largest and safest steamer in the world, sailing on her maiden voyage 10th April 1912 to New York from Southampton"

A picture of Nichols on a ship deck with ship's bell behind him, together with a copy of his letter dated April 8th 1909 written on headed paper of the ship "Adriatic," to his Uncle William and Aunt Hanna Nichols on the island, is featured.

His daughter Jean and grand daughter Anne from Wales, visited Lord Howe some 20 years ago to visit his birthplace. Anne's brother has Albert's boatswains whistle as a prized memento.

Apparently, when the Titanic was sinking, Albert gave his whistle to a crew member to hand to his wife Grace, before going below decks to assist the remaining crew. Albert perished with the ship. *Acknowledgement to Pinetrees, Lord Howe Island 1842-1992-Kerry McFadyen*

TAREE AND MANNING VALLEY'S LINKS WITH LORD HOWE ISLAND

Elizabeth (Beth) McMath Singleton was born at Taree NSW on 21st September 1906 (39575/1906) to Andrew McMath Singleton and Ruby S M Singleton (nee Dangar) who were married at Kempsey NSW (4180/1902).

The Singleton family lived near my Grandparents William Henry (Bill) and Edith Jessie (Edie) Richardson, in the close knit farming community of Mondrook, between Tinonee and Wingham, on the Eastern bank of the Manning River

The Richardson family of eight girls and two boys naturally formed a strong friendship with the Singleton family which comprised at least three girls. In 1930 Beth Singleton married Gerald George Massy Kirby (5142/1930) who was born on Lord Howe Island 13th November 1902 (32972/1902).

Gerald, known as "Kirb" was educated at Newington College Sydney and became a successful assistant sales manager for Wunderlichs in Sydney, selling roofing products. After the marriage and the commencement of the great depression, they moved to Lord Howe temporarily to help his widowed mother run the guest house then known as "The Pines", with the intention of resuming his sales career when times improved. They were never to return to live on the mainland.

When his mother saw how well he and Beth took to managing the guest house, she stepped back, retiring from the physical work of the guest house. The rest is history.

As the guest house progressed and prospered with the hard work put in by the energetic and gregarious couple, the need for staff arose and Beth summoned her friend Lillian Hazel (Hazel) Richardson, her former neighbour and friend at Mondrook to come and work for her, knowing hat she competently ran the big household on the farm.

This worked well for some time until Hazel met and fell in love with a visiting postal employee in Walter H (Wal) Bowles. The need to replace Hazel arose so a despatch was sent off to Mondrook for Hazel's Sister Evie to replace her. Edith Evelyn Richardson came to Lord Howe soon after and took up duties at "The Pines".

Evie there met up with an islander in Edward James (Jim) King and they were married in Sydney 21st November 1936. This time however, Evie remained on the island for some 65 years until following Jim's death in 1983 and her gradual decline in health, she moved to the mainland, and Taree, to receive adequate health care and supervised accommodation. Evie had become quite an identity on Lord Howe, with her cooking, butter making, gardening etc. She was instrumental in helping save the endangered Lord Howe Island Woodhen.

A former dairy company cream boat, on retirement from plying the waters of the Manning River, collecting milk and cream from farms, was taken to Lord Howe to end its working life.

The boat's name escapes me, however, it could have been "Sunrise," "Sunshine,"or "Sunbeam.".
